Our Programs

CanSkate Stages 1-3

CanSkate is a learn-to-skate program for skaters aged 3 years and up. It consists of structured group lessons designed to develop agility, balance, and control. Skaters will be evaluated at the start to determine their level and will receive a progress report upon completion of the session.

Half Season (10 weeks) and Full Season (20 weeks) available. Mandatory Skate Canada Fee of \$58.70 is applicable for each skater once in the 2023-2024 Season and included in the prices below.

CanSkate Stages 4-6

This CanSkate session will consist of warm up, lesson time, group activity and a cool down. Each week will focus on balance, control, and agility to assist in the development of skaters skating abilities. Skaters will receive a progress report upon completion of the session.

Mandatory Skate Canada Fee of \$58.70 is applicable for each skater once in the 2023-2024 Season and included in the price below.

STARSkate

The StarSkate program is designed specifically for figure skating skill development. Lessons at this level are normally done with a coach, in either semi-private or private sessions. Skaters can also use ice time without a coach.

Ice time is available Mondays & Thursdays. Skaters can choose up to 3 hours/week from the following options:
